The second Alberta Falls waterslide, from ProSlide, is now open to guests. This brings the slide count up to 12 in the 80,000-square-foot indoor waterpark, Bear Track Landing.

ond in the Alberta Falls duo of tube slides launching from the 80-foot indoor slide tour. Faster than it's twin, guests travel 18-feet per second on single or double inner tubes before dropping into a plunge pool below. With each twist

and turn, guests travel inside and outside the waterpark in the enclosed slides covering almost 750 feet combined.

The completion of Alberta Falls adds more thrills and screams of delight in the 84-degree indoor waterpark.

Complete with 12 indoor waterslides, including the Howlin' Tornado funnel slide, seven pools and an interactive treehouse Fort Mackenzie, guests of all ages continue to make family memories.

Safety is the number one priority at Great Wolf Lodge. Due to the waterpark only being available to resort guests, capacity is maintained at a comfortable level and more personal attention is provided by more than 100 lifeguards on staff.
